WARM UP

As men we struggle with the concept of surrendering. We grow up with stories of victory in warfare, triumph against all odds. However in our journey as men of God we must come to a point where we can sit in wonder and awe of a Father who has provided life, in creating and forming us, but also supplying the key to eternity.

Sitting speaks of our moment, or moments, of surrender. We surrender to the finished (complete) work of the cross; to God's opinion of us rather than our limited opinion of Him. The context of our surrender is the assurance of our salvation in Christ. In Ephesians Paul talks about this as being a guideline to living a kingdom life.

READ Ephesians 2:6

BACKGROUND

Paul starts Ephesians by proclaiming the power of the Gospel and its effect on humanity, breaking the distance and delay associated with traditional religion. He gives them a clear explanation of their true position. Heaven - it's a reference to where God has placed us – with the privilege of sitting next to the Father because of the finished work of the cross. It transforms the way we live as we realise that we truly "start at the finish". Jesus did enough, and as we realise that, we cannot help but surrender to the only "work" that truly matters: the death, resurrection and ascension of Christ.
