

WARM UP

Willie Nelson apparently at one time owned a golf course. He said the great thing about owning a golf course was that he could decide what the par was for each hole. He pointed at one hole and said, “See that hole there? It’s a par 47. Yesterday I birdied it”. It’s tempting to live life like that isn’t it? Instead of keeping God’s standard for life, we lower the bar, and whilst we may feel better about ourselves for a while in the end we have to face up to the fact that we aren’t living the way God intended. Holiness isn’t God’s way of ruining our fun – it’s His path to freedom. It’s about shaking free from the hold of sin and discovering what it really means to be alive.

BACKGROUND

In this passage Jesus proves at least one thing to every man listening: Holiness does not come naturally! If what Jesus says is true, then every man has committed adultery at least once by this definition. The standard is beyond us. Sinning is what comes naturally so to conquer those natural desires is going to take something supernatural. Holiness is a product of the Holy Spirit, not our natural efforts to be good.



READ Matthew 5:27-30



QUESTIONS FOR INTERACTION

Study Genesis 39:7-12 and 2 Samuel 11:1-4. Compare the events in Joseph’s and David’s lives.

1. What were the circumstances of the stories?
2. What were their respective attitudes?

CONSIDER THIS
