### CONSIDER THIS

Dr Ed Cole, who is considered the father of the modern Men's Movement, had a maxim that he used all the time, which has become a catch phrase of Christian Men's Network: "Manhood and Christlikeness are synonymous".

When we want to become like someone, what do we do? Say, for example, you are trying to get your golf handicap down. You want to become the best golfer you can be. So you decide to try to be like Tiger Woods. You would copy him; read what he has to say; emulate his swing; learn how he putts; wear what he wears; exercise like he exercises; work like he works; train like he trains, and so on. In other words, in every way you do your best to be just like him. If you were lucky enough to have some personal relationship with Tiger, you would take every opportunity to spend time with him, and if he gave you advice and instruction, then you would do your utmost to apply it. The goal - to be the same as Tiger.
